7. ABOUT THE COMMUNITIES

(a) Homeless Community, Lal Bagh Jhuggi, Kheda Gaon, Ram Nagar Slum Community, Mansarover Park.

Location: East Delhi

Population: 4320

Sex : Male - 1250, Female - 1720, Children – 1350

This area lacks in basic amenities such as public toilet, road drainage system, drinking water problem etc. The people are illiterate and living in slum and most of them are homeless. They have no sensitisation toward their own problem. Infect food and shelter is primary for them whereas health becomes the secondary issue. One can also observe the case of drug abuse in the area. Overall scenario is an urgent need of attention towards health and education to develop the area.

(b) Mansarover Park community is situated opposite to Mansarover Garden Metro Station for the last 6 years. It consists of around 500 families of tribal people.

This community has around 1300 children. Most of them are beggars, rag-pickers and illiterate. They do not have basic amenities like electricity and education facilities.

- **(c) Kheda Gauo Mansarover Park-** this is slum area and location name is **Kheda Gauo.** There is 400 to 500 Jhuggi. Male members of this Jhuggi are labor in the factories, rickshaw pullers etc. Most of the people staying in the community are illiterate. Most common issues are health, hygiene, education, awareness about the fundamental right and Govt. scheme etc.
- (d) Rakshaks Foundation is working to provide underprivileged people of their basic rights, education and to make awareness about government schemes. We have also collaborated with few organizations and with their help we are organizing daily awareness camps, events and helping the community to connect with Government Schemes.

9. DEVELOPMENT WORK FOR UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN

(a) Done Formal Education CLASS:- Our Foundation works for the underprivileged children in Majnu ka Tila and Mansarover Park. We motivate peoples living in slum areas regarding education. We also provide education for non school going children. Foundation enrolls 30 children at Mansarover Park and 35 children at Majnu ka Tila and conducting regular classes. The children are also coming for special education in the training center run regularly at the Rakshaks Foundation Skill Development center. We also provide books and stationary facilities to these children. Foundation is following the Right to

Education Act 2005 and had given admission to 20 children in the government school according to this act. Our peer educators provide the children with good education, moral education, Health and Hygiene Empowerment, Art & Craft, Bal Sabha etc. Rakshaks Foundation's peer educators admitted 12 children in MCD Govt School making sure that the children are regularly going to school, this marking a big achievement of our work.

(b) Art & Craft Classes: Foundation had also included art and craft class for the under privileged children and youth. A total number of 60 students participated in the class and involved in making of some recycling products like – News Paper Bag, News Paper Pens, Hair Clips, Mobile cover, Diya painting, handmade flowers and mats etc. The children participated in learning about the crafts and made different products. Our peer educators gave full involvement and dedication in giving the children these opportunities of learning the art and craft activities.

(c) Independence Day celebration: To develop national integrity among the people of deprived category our foundation celebrated Independence Day on 15 Aug 2016 with the underprivileged children at Lal Bagh Jhuggi, Mansarover Park. Around 150 children participated in this program. Foundation organized activities such as Dance, Drawing, Singing, Quiz, competition and other entertainment

activities. Children enjoyed all those activities and also got to know about Independence day. All the participants were very much interested and full of enthusiasm and excitement during the performances. Foundation Co-coordinator Ms. Pooja distributed the prizes and refreshment of children and also gave awareness about the Independence Day celebration. Children were happy satisfied by the celebration. Considering the outcomes the program conducted was a very successful event.

- (d) Life Skill Training: With collaboration of "Leaders for tomorrow", Rakshaks Foundation organized a Life Skill Training, education Class for kids living in Slum areas for three months on weekly basis. 32 children participated in this training camp. We covered the following topics under the life skill training program:
 - i. How to develop Self hygiene habits
 - ii. Health education and awareness
 - iii. Give respect to elders
 - iv. Teach them about Emotions
 - v. Yoga training for fitness
 - vi. Empathy and sympathy
 - vii. Moral education
 - viii.Right to education
 - ix. Alphabets and counting
 - **(e) Bal Sabha:** Foundation is organizing Bal Sabha on regular basis. **Bal Sabha** is for kids living in slum area where we teach and give them information about different festivals, different ways of celebration and also about our culture and traditions. In **Bal Sabha** we are also conducting fun activities for children every month.

(f) Children's Day Celebration:- Foundation has organized Children's Day celebration program in with collaboration with WNC company Gourd Gaou and

Mr. Arun Gupta, Ms. Zana Beni Kikon with all team. They provided refreshment, prizes and gifts on 12 November 2016 at MCD Park Garden, Shahadara. 40 children and 35 youth girls participated and total number of beneficiary were 75 students. Activities and programs like Singing, Running, Quiz and Mehandi competition. Kho-Kho game was also organized and the children enjoyed the game. After the program, refreshment were given to the children and Ms. Zana Beni Kikon, Mr. Arun Gupta distributed prizes to the winning participants. The program came out to be very successful

Then she is admitted in 3rd class MCD Government School. Her drawing, art & craft is good and she is involved to every social activities.

His father and mother both are indulged in begging work. During the outreach work our staff reached there and mobilizes his family and approached them to send the child for our NFE class. Jatin very actively participative to all activities like Studies, Drawing, Craft, Painting, Poem Recitation etc. Now he's admitted in 3rd class Primary Mcd Govt School

10 Community Development of work:

- (a) Community mel-jol meeting: In this session foundation had organized 15 Mel-jol meetings (180 participants) and 17 issue based meeting with poor people on different topic/issues. There are lots of social and community issues which can solved for their better life. We are planning to organize more and more community based meetings with poor people for solving their problems and simplify their life. During community based meeting following topics were discussed, Bank Account opening, Voter ID card, Health awareness, Sanitation, Drug-de-addiction, HIV/AIDS Awareness, SHG formation, and saving, children education etc.
- (b) Mobilization of peoples in communities: Foundation mobilizes poor and homeless community; provide them counseling to make productive adults. Foundation also motivates children and their parents about all the government schemes, laws and also connects them with all the schemes of government. Foundation also mobilized people at Bangla Sahib Community and motivates them about all the schemes of government. We also conducted regular meeting with people and community on various issues like children's health their education etc. The main agenda of meeting was on preventive health care in relation to common ailment such as Chikungunia and Dengue Fever and advise them to protect themselves from these diseases during onset of rainy seasons. We also mobilize to youth for enrollment for skill development training. Many people admitted to our training center at Mansarover Park.

11. AWARENESS CAMPS: Foundation has organized awareness camp during of this 2016 to 2017 for the under privileged people and we covered the important topics i.e. Health Hazards of Smoking, Tuberculosis, HIV/AIDS, Organ Donation, Hepatitis, Health & Hygiene, Education, Saving & Investment etc. at slum area Majnu ka Tila and Manasarover Park. Lot of people participated in these camps. During this year we have conducted about 15 such Camps. Total number of person attended our awareness camp are as under Male 150, Female -180, Children-85, Total - 415

12. WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

(a) Health & Hygiene of Menstruation meeting with young girls: Foundation is organizing a meeting on safety menstruation with underprivileged young girls at skill development training Centre, Mansarover Park. New Delhi. Mrs. Vidhiya Thapa, Mrs Maharani from (Action India) Special educators came to provide training to them. During the menstruation period how to clean yourself, take healthy food and also aware them about the health & hygiene. In the every month 30 to 35 students are participating. In this year our organization conducted 12 classes and 120 young girls and women have taken part in the training.

- (d) Computer Application Course: Rakshaks Foundation has started computer application course with effect from March 2017. Rakshaks Foundation's aim is to train youth's, women's, children's about Digital Transaction through mobile and computer. Initially we have started with 4 students, who has been enrolled in this course. We have five computer systems at Moti Nagar in Mansarover Park training Centre. All students are coming regularly in center for computer classes. The youth of underprivileged society are happy to attend the computer classes. We are sure that we will be able to train more number of youth and women to make them a part of Digital India plan.
- **(e) Beautician Culture course:** Foundation has started beautician culture course in the month of March 2017. This course will help ladies to become self dependent. Presently 5 students have been enrolled in this course. Adolescent girls are coming in center for learning beautician culture course. They are happy with our foundation and we are trying more students to enroll for this course.
- (f) Workshop for Women: Foundation has organized women empowerment workshop for homeless communities with collaboration with **Central Board for Worker Education Govt of India.** A program for women on SHG, vocational

training, Health & hygiene, small saving schemes, important of children education, family planning, livelihood, Human right, legal information with Act, and government welfare schemes etc. with collaboration of Central Board for Worker Education (Govt. of India) at Mansarover Park. 320 women participated in workshop this year. Speakers from the Govt Department/other NGO were present and they all appreciated our foundation's approach towards women empowerment, they also agreed to organize such workshops in future. This program has been organized in the month of March and April 2017.

- (i) Mr. Yogender Singh, PGT Teacher from Kendriya Vidyalaya has explained people about Right to Education Act, Government schemes for education till 8th class and also provided uniform, scholarships. He also assists and advises children to get admission in the Govt School. He encourages and urged the people to make people aware with the agenda of Indian Govt to achieve the goal of 100% literacy rate by 2020.
- (ii) Ms. Rozina Khan, a social worker from "Child for Welfare Society" has also visited the center and explained about the self employment generation. Her organization is working for youths. Society helps in making products through recycling of waste products such as Paper pen, paper bag etc.
- (iii) Mr. Rakesh Sharma, from Punjab National Bank Financial Dept has explained about the management of income and importance of small saving. He made people awaked about saving and its relation to future, how one can save money with minimum investment in banks. Money is very important as it is needed at every step of life like festival, marriage, injury, illness, diseases, children education, etc.
- **(iv) Vocational Training:** Ms. Pooja, Foundation coordinator made people aware about the benefits of vocational training like stitching, beautician etc. 30-35 women participated in this workshop. Foundation started stitching classes for homeless people. 10 girls enrolled with us. Foundation is also planning to provide them placement after finishing their course.
- (v) Government welfare Scheme: Foundation conducted a workshop on Government's Welfare Schemes and Mr. Vivek Kumar aware people about widow pension, disability pension, old age pension, Ladali yojana, and open the account under jan dhan yojana etc.

- (vi) Health & Hygiene:- Dr. Deepak from Red Cross (India) has provided lecture on health and hygiene and women health problem.
- (vii) Self Help Group: Foundation spread awareness among people about the benefit of Self Help Group and how it can help to get loan from Banks and micro finance system. After establishing SHG, Bank will provide them Loan according to their saving. We teach them about savings and its benefits. In SHG, a woman has to save Rs-5 per day and deposit Rs 100/month to SHG. The group name is Mahila Shakti Samuha and it consists of ten members in each group.

(viii)Family Planning: Mr. Hoshiyar Singh, a Social Worker has taken a lecture on family planning and its benefit. He inspired them to adopt two child policy and how a small familybeneficial to educate their children and one can lead a happy life.

(g) SCHOLARSHIPS OF WOMEN'S: Foundation has organized women's awareness camp in collaboration with Central Board for Worker Education Govt of India. In the camp 40 women participated and 5 of them got scholarship cheque of Rs 500/each from Central Board for Worker Education Govt of India

(h) SELF DEFENSE TRAINING:- Mr. Chander Bhan Singh and Mr. Bhagwan Dass SHO Mansarover Park, Delhi Police have provided them the self defense training and explained its importance. They also taught them about the self defense techniques and its importance in our life. They make the community aware with regards to Police Helpline Number 100. If case of any violence in society or any misconduct by any stranger or even persecuted by your husband or children at your home, you can raise an alarm by calling of police on calling 100 number. Your safety is in your hands

13. HEALTH CARE:

(a) Free Eyes Check-Up Camp:- Foundation Organized a Free Eyes Check up Camp with collaboration of Dr. Sharff Hospital at Mansarover Park community. Total 66 persons were benefited out of which 17 male, 48 female, 08 children and 28 were old age person and 21 cases were referred to hospital for Cataract Operation. All operations were successfully conducted. We have provided them with free medicines and a vehicle to reach home post operation. All of these patients belonged to poor families and 50% are homeless.

(b) PREVENTION & CONTROL OF T.B, HIV AIDS, DIABETES & TOBACCO USE WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO YOUTH

Rakshaks Foundation has been organizing training camps on Prevention & control of Tuberculosis, HIV AIDS, Diabetes, Tobacco Chewing, Gutkha and smoking through collaboration with Delhi Tuberculosis Association 9-Institutional Area, Lodhi Road New Delhi-110 003. In the training Dr. S.M Govil (General Sec) from Delhi TB Association, Dr. Shareen and DOTs team from south Delhi dots dispensary has delivered lectures on prevention and control of diseases above. Our organization provided refreshment and distributed participation certificates to people attended training on the subjects. All about 150 youths have participated form the different organization and the training was very knowledgeable for all these youths. It was very successful training program.
