7. **ABOUT THE COMMUNITIES**

We are running Skill Development Training Project under foundation's ***Srijan Project***, in the slum areas of Lal Bhag Jhuggi, Railway Colony, Kheda Gaon, Sanchar Colony , Mansarover Park, Shahdra, North- East Delhi And West Delhi.

In the slum communities mostly community belongs to different religion and cast, the source of their income is through working in packaging industries, begging, doing labor work, rickshaw pullers, maids and tribal woman peoples mostly doing Naach-Gana, Bajana.

In these communities the approximate number of children, woman and old age people who are homeless is around 270 to 280 out of total population of 1120. And in Lal Bhag Jhuggi, the domicile holder is approx. 290 to 300 out of total population of 1800. In Railway community domicile holder is approximately 160 to 180 only out of population of 720 approx. In communities, all of them are below poverty line. Most of the children are not going to school due to lack of money and they have chosen the profession of begging for their livelihood along with their parents at the different parts of the city like Metro Station, Food Conner, Market Area, Bus Stand, Railway Station and Door To Door In Colonies.

Residents are mostly illiterate, mostly dependent on seasonal work. Their source of income is very less, somehow managing with little resources. They are living in Delhi from past 12 to 15 years, but still due to lack of education and proper guidance, they are not able to get their Government ID cards, facing problem in getting school admission for children, There is a lack of proper health and hygiene in these communities due to ignorance and non –awareness. Some of the NGOs like Rakshaks foundation are helping these communities-

- in providing guidance towards education facilities to the children of these communities,
- closely working and coordinating with different government institutions in providing Aadhar cards, Voter id cards.
- Also Rakshaks volunteers helping them in opening of bank accounts.
- Providing them Skill development trainings.
- Conducting classes, and spreading awareness about their right of information, Health and Hygiene, Child protection and also supporting them in their basic needs like electricity, providing clean drinking water etc.

8. सृजन Project

INTRODUCTION

We are running a Skill Development Training Center under सृजन Project at Moti Ram Road, Mansarovar Park, Delhi.

सृजन means Creation. Similarly, the objective of the सृजन project is generating income and providing livelihood through their Skill Development program for young girls of the community.

Under this Project we provide- Cutting & Tailoring course, Fashion Designing Course, Beauty Culture, Mahendi Design, Crochet, Computer Application, etc. Both Certificate and Diploma courses are available. The सृजन Project -Skill Development Training has been initiated for the adolescent girls above 14 years to 40 years of age.

So in सृजन project, approx.60 to 70 girls from North-East Delhi's slum areas come to the center daily for training. After completion of the course, these girls are given the respective certificates by foundation. Thus, the सृजन Project makes better economical conditions for the girls, generating a better livelihood by providing placements.

iv) STUDENTS PLACEMENT

Placement is given to the students who are in foundation and completed the course with certification.

The Foundation has collaboration with other organization and privates companies, local tailor shops, government agency etc. Students who have completed Courses like Cutting & Tailoring, Guards, Housekeeping, Beauty culture, Mehendi culture, etc. are well placed with some of these sectors with an earning of Rs. 200 to 300 per day or having monthly income of around 7000 to 9000 /-

Our Government has a vision of Poverty free India and to provide various opportunities to youth of India for employments and Start ups. So Rakshaks foundation aimed and targeted to provide various opportunities to underprivileged to get the jobs and employments. Rakshaks Foundation supported 47 young girls under project Srijan, 50 guards, 50 housekeeping youths in providing placements in Delhi.

 <p>Name: Pooja Age : 20 year old Education : B.A pursuing form Delhi university</p>	<p>She is 20 year old girl pursuing B.A from Delhi university SOL. Her family includes 3 younger sister and one brother. Father is working in factory as a laborer and mother is a house wife, They are from UP, Gonda district and living in Delhi from past 21 years.</p> <p>Pooja contacted us 3 years ago, when she completed her senior secondary exams from government school. She was very shy and introvert and non confident person. But with the support of Rakshaks foundation, she was given proper counseling, guidance on skill development training on cutting and tailoring, moral education etc. Gradually she picked up and started showing progress Her life has completely changed after this session and also started earning by stitching and tailoring.</p> <p>Now she has become the cutting & tailoring peer educator and teaches the other community members in Srijan Project of Rakshaks Foundation. Rakshaks Foundation is glad to share her story as this an achievement for them also towards making better community. Pooja family is also very happy with this support.</p>
 <p>Name: Sajan Devi Age: 43 year old Education: NIL Husband's Name: Shri Suresh Yadav</p>	<p>Sajan Devi is 43 years old illiterate lady. Her Husband is working as Rajmistrty (labor work) with a monthly income of 5000 to 6000/-. Her family includes 4 year old daughter and 1 year old son. They belong to Darbhanga of Bihar district. Sajan Devi lives in a very small house of slum community of Railway Colony at Mansarover Park Delhi from past 22 years. Though she is a very hard working lady, but due to poor economical situation, family was struggling for day to day needs. Rakshaks Foundation supported her in providing cutting and tailoring courses till she completed. Now with complete support of our foundation, she has become self sufficient and has been mobilized in opening her own cutting and tailoring shop near her residence with the monthly earning of Rs. 6000/-appox. Now able to support her family with extra income and providing them with better education and health.</p> <p>Sajan Devi 's family is happy with Rakshaks foundation's efforts towards them and our team is very much satisfied with their achievement in making better community.</p>

 <p>Name : Nisha Age : 19 years Education : 12th passed</p>	<p>Nisha is a 19 year old girl and completed her senior secondary education from government school. Her father work as a vegetable seller and mother is a house wife. She is elder and has 2 brothers and 2 sisters, who have never gone to school due to lack of funds as their economical condition was not good. Nisha is very much Interested in completing her higher education but couldn't continue.</p> <p>Rakshaks Foundation supported her and provided counseling, guidance. Also helped her in learning of mehendi art design and cutting & tailoring in Foundation's training center at Manasarover Park under Srijan project. She successfully completed the above trainings. Now she is self sufficient and earning a monthly income of Rs. 5000 to 6000/- by stitching and tailoring ladies clothes. Her family members are also very happy with the support she is providing to them.</p> <p>Foundation is glad to share this achievement in the communities at Lal Bhag Jhuggi.</p>
 <p>Name: Ankita Age: 17 years Education: 10th passed</p>	<p>Ankita is a 17 years old girl, belongs to a very poor family. Her father Shri Rameshwar, working as a labour and mother is a maid. Her siblings includes 1 brother and 4 sister, 2 elder sisters are married. When Rakshaks Foundation staff came to know about their condition, they met Ankita' family and conducted various counseling sessions. Finally, with their consent, Ankita started learning Mahendi art classes and Beauty culture classes at Foundation's training centre, where she successfully completed her training. She was very regular and active student. Now, Ankita is running a beauty parlour, which she started with the support of Rakshaks Foundation. She is earning around 6 to 7000 per month. Also continuing with her studies. Her Family is very happy with Rakshaks foundation support and we are also glad to contribute towards better community .</p>

 <p>Name : Suman Age : 17 Years Education : Studying in class 11th</p>	<p>Suman is 17 years old girl, an intelligent student studying Commerce in 11th Standard. Her father is working in Copper Factory and mother is a house wife. She has a younger brother studying in class 6 in government school. Suman has shown a lot of interest in all vocational activities She has learned Mahendi Culture, Stitching & tailoring, and Beauty Parlour courses organized by Rakshaks foundation in various communities. She is very proactive who has learned everything at an early age. Her family is very proud of her as now she is capable of funding her education cost and earning a monthly income. Happy family makes happy and healthy community. This is one more feather in Rakshaks foundation contribution towards society.</p>
 <p>Name : Preeti Kumara Age : 20 years Education : 12th passed</p>	<p>Preeti is a 20 years old girl. She was studying in 12th standard in Bihar. Preeti came to Delhi in 2016 with her mother and started living in the slums of Mansarovar Park. Our volunteer Mr. Vivek counseled her in one of the counseling camps organized by Rakshaks Foundation. During counseling session he came to know that her father is a Cancer patient from last 5 years, and his treatment is going on in Government Hospital and mother doing the maid job in different societies. She told about herself that she wanted to become a doctor but due to poor economical conditions, couldn't pay the fees. With the support of Rakshaks foundation, she got herself enrolled for Stitching and tailoring course, and completed successfully, Now she is running her own cutting and tailoring centre with an earnings of Rs. 6000 to Rs. 10,000/- She got her self enrolled for further studies also and now have become self sufficient. Her family is very happy with this support. Rakshaks Foundation is also feeling blissful in contributing towards her growth.</p>

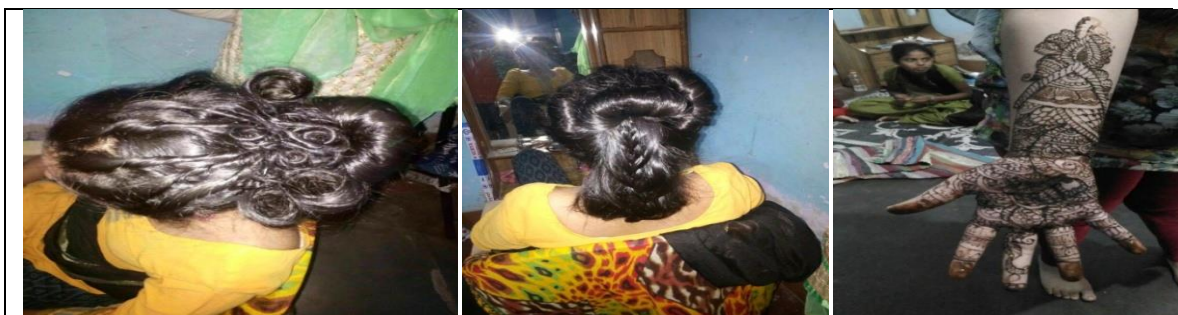

Foundation has started Beauty culture course under **Srijan** project . Srijan aims to provide support to every young girl in communities to make them economically independent and to help them to live a better life with respect and pride. Around 20 young girls of Slum areas got enrolled in beauty culture courses.

5 out of 20 girls successfully completed the courses and now they are earning around 150 to 200 rupees per day by giving various beauty culture services to clients (services includes- Mehndi designs, Hair styling, Makeup and other related beautician services).

Srijan foundation is looking forward to working with them in near future also to provide training to other girls.

ii) Woman awareness program conducted in this year 2017-2018

Foundation has been organizing awareness program with collaboration of Central Board of Worker Education, Government of India, for the women empowerment in the different topics like- Saving Schemes, Education Right, Fundamental Right, Health & Hygiene etc.

Rakshaks Foundation has invited various Government agencies and NGOs as a speaker.

1	Right to Education 	<p>➤ Foundation has invited Ms. Suchi (Project Coordinator) from Salam Balak Trust. She shared her knowledge about the Child education. And gave her insight about Right to education of every child. She also made community aware that in government schools education is free of cost till 8th standard also they can get books, stationery, uniform also free of cost. And in Public schools, there is 25% EWS quota ie. Below Poverty line. If you want admission in the public school you should get registration online before March month. This knowledge sharing session was very helpful and provided proper guidance to the community members.</p>
2	Fundamental Rights	<p>➤ Foundation has invited Mr. Varun Pathak (Advocate) working as a legal Advisor. He gave his experienced insight about the fundamental rights given in Indian Constitution. He shared the knowledge on our right of voting, education, freedom, foods etc.</p>

3	Health & Hygiene & T.B, Cancer, HIV AIDS Disease 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Dr. Deepak from Red Cross Organization was invited and he shared the knowledge on how to maintain and keep proper health and hygiene. ➤ Foundation has invited Dr. Pushpanjali Gupta, Tuberculosis diseases specialist from Delhi Government Dispensary Shahadara. She shared facts on disease tuberculosis, and also inform about the disadvantages of eating tobacco, smoking, Hookah, etc. which causes cancer and TB.
4	Government welfare schemes 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Foundation has invited Mrs. A.M. Ansari from Central Boards For Worker Education Government Of India. She informed about the various Government Welfare Schemes like – Old Pension, Widow Pension, Handicapped Pension, Atal Pension, Sukaniya Yojna, Adhar Linking With Banks, Education Loan, etc. these type of scheme is available for all residents of India. And they should avail these schemes and further information about these from MLA office, SDM office, Delhi Welfare Department.
5	Social Problems 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Ms. Bhawan Yadav, Senior Manager from (TISS) TATA Institute of Social works Department was invited. She discussed about the various social problems prevailing in society like – Drug addiction, Poverty, Alcohol Abuse, Sexual Abuse, Unemployments, Female Genital Mutilation etc. Also gave her insight about how to deal with these evils prevailing in society.
6	Self Defense Training	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Mr. Chander Bhan Singh and SHO Mansarovar Park, Delhi Police, provided the Self Defense Training and explained its importance. Also informed the community about various helpline number of police, which can be used at the time of crisis. This knowledge sharing came very handy to the community and they were happy to know about these programs.

10) **Community Development work:-**

- a) **Mel-jol Meeting:-** Every month, we are conducting meeting with homeless people in the communities like women, men, youth and children. In these meetings or discussions, we take up the topics like, Child School Admission, Health & Hygiene Issues, Ration Card, Voter Id Card, Aadhar Card, Employment, Pensions, Women's Health and Hygiene, Bank Account Opening, etc.
During the year 2017 -2018, Rakshaks foundation has conducted 156 meetings, in which total number of participation of women was 230, male was 190 and children were 310 respectively, it was very successful event.
- b) **Mobilization:-** As per the action plan made by Rakshaks foundation for the whole year, the volunteers of the foundation are visiting various communities on regular basis, wherein they are doing door to door campaigns, talking and understanding various problems faced by them. Also doing counselling and guiding them about their rights of education, benefits of education. Foundation team is also helping communities young members to enroll in various skill development camps organized by Rakshaks, to benefit them to become economically independent. All these centres are running with good healthy environment with trainings like Cutting & Tailoring, Mehndi culture, Beautician course etc.
The advantage of this door to door campaign was that Rakshaks foundation was able to enroll 255 students in their centres in the year 2017-2018.
- c) **Bal Sabha:-** we are running NFE classes in center. Every day approx. 35 to 40 children are attending classes. The age for the one group is around 5 to 12 years, another group is of 13 to 17 years old. And in a month 2 sessions are conducted for children called as **"BAL Sabha" (bacho ki sabha)**. In these sessions, children are encouraged to ask their doubts by having question answer sessions. Most of their questions are based on Health & Hygiene, cleanliness, basic needs, about their education progress etc.

11) HealthCare

Rakshaks Foundation has conducted a session on young girl's health issues and invited faculty from **Action India Organization**. The faculty members were Mrs. Vidhya Thapa, Mrs. Maharani, Mrs. Kavita Singh.

Various Topics covered are related to health issues like;

- Earliest pregnancy,
- Sexual transmitted disease,
- Hygienes issues,
- Menstruation
- Anaemia problems etc.
- Health camp

Total of 12 sessions conducted. Every month one topic was covered and in every session, total number of girls benefitted by these program were approx. 30 to 35. All girls participated in these sessions with great enthusiasm and very openly asked the questions related to their health issues. They got a good knowledge and got aware about health issues.

In some sessions, they also got tips on healthy makeup, beauty tips etc.

12) FUND RAISING

- People associated with our foundation i.e. young girls and women are making items like- **Diya Decoration** from waste items **during diwali**.
- Foundation has received order by National Commission Protection Child Right, WNC Company, SBI Bank, local Delhi people, NGO . These orders for making diyas was taken by communities working under foundation and by selling these, some funds was raised for helping poor and community members.
- These handmade Diyas were very much liked by customers. The decoration on these diyas was done by young girls of communities.

The various advantages was

- ✓ All diyas sold out during diwali.
- ✓ Decoration was done by recycling and handmade work
- ✓ this was very natural product
- ✓ Community members got employment. The raw materials cost of making these items was very low.

13. Child Development

- a) **Child Education and N.F.E classes:** - We are running child education NFE classes in the Mansarovar Park Shahdra. During the year 2017 to 2018, Foundation has conducted basic education for underprivileged children covering the following;
- ✓ Moral Education
 - ✓ Communication with elderly people
 - ✓ Values
 - ✓ Fundamental right under child education
 - ✓ Stories for motivation
 - ✓ Bal Sabha meeting with children
 - ✓ Drawing and painting
 - ✓ Art and crafts
 - ✓ Health and hygiene issues etc.

As in communities, children under the age of 5 to 14 years were not going to school. They were guided and provided proper counseling, also got enrolled in various schools. As all of them fall in the different age group, so while providing guidance, the Right to Education Act, 2009 was followed.

Children who were eligible for school admissions were counseled, also supported them in getting enrolled in MCD government schools. In this year, around 35 students of communities got admission in school according to RTE Act.

5 years old child got enrolled in 1st class, 6 years old child in 2nd class, 8 years old in 3rd class and 9 years old in 4th class and 10 years old child was admitted in 5th class respectively. These law and act was followed. Total number of children 36 and 15 children got enrolled in the MCD Primary government school. It was a very good achievement of the year for foundation.

b) Children's Day Celebration: -

We organized children's day celebration on 14.11.2017 at MCD Park in the Mansarover Park Shahadra in collaboration of WNC company from Gurugram. Ms. Zana Beni Kikon, Public Relationship Officer provided all the games material and stationeries etc for the program. We conducted games like – racing, kho- kho, lemon- spoon race, and singing song children dance etc. After that they gave refreshment to all children and staff. Winners were given gift prizes by our Guest. All children enjoyed very much and understood the importance of Children's day celebration also.

c) Diwali Celebration:-

We celebrated Diwali festival with underprivileged children and young girls of our centers. Total number of members participated were around 50 to 60. WNS company, Gurugram provided crackers etc for children enjoyment. They also did Diya Decoration and enjoyed very much. It was very successful event organized by Rakshaks Foundation.



d) Teacher's Day Celebration:-

Foundation has organized Teacher's day celebration with all the center students. They made greeting cards for Rakshaks Foundation's trainers and centre in charge. They had cake cutting ceremony and then refreshments were distributed among all students.

e) Counseling session :-

On monthly basis, we are conducting counseling sessions for young girls. These session are basically for those young girls who are attending skill and development programs at our centers. They were given motivation classes in these group counseling sessions. Last year in one of these sessions, Rakshaks foundation invited Ms. Rekha, from the Delhi Woman Commission Government (DCW) of India. She took the session and provided the counseling session as per the need of student's queries and guided them about the problems faced during the training like how to handle the course syllabus, practical and theory work, time management, work life balance etc along with their other household activities. Because at this young age, they have to support their families also, they should know work life balance. If they put just little more hard work then they can achieve their goals successfully. And Rakshaks foundation is happily supporting them towards this and contributing to better society.

15. NETWORKING:
