(k) To setup vocational training centers for children and women of economically weaker section.



#### 7. Project Srijan : A Programme for Youth Employment and Women Empowerment.

We are running a Skill Development Training Center under Project **Srijan** at Plot No.18, Vivanta Residence, Matiyala, Sector-3, Dwarka, New Delhi-110059. Under this project, we offer both Certificate and Diploma courses in Computer Application, Cutting & Tailoring, Fashion Designing, Beauty & Culture Parlour, Mehandi Design, etc. Under the project Srijan, skill development training has been initiated for the adolescent girls above 14 years to women upto 40 years of age.



8. The Project **Srijan** offers better economical conditions and generating a better livelihood for the girls by providing skill development training. **Srijan** means Creation, thus the very objective of the project **Srijan** is creation of employment avenues for women especially young girls. In project **Srijan**, we cover the whole North-East Delhi's slum areas and approx. 60 to 70 girls come to the center daily for develop their skills. On completion of course, foundation provides respective certificates.



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#### **RAKSHAKS FOUNDATION : VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER**

9. The Rakshaks Foundation has been came into being in 2015 and since its inception, we have been putting up efforts for skill development of youth and deprived sections of the society especially young girls and ladies. In the Vocational Training Centre they polish their skills in a way that they stand face-to-face with the requirements of today's demanding and challenging job market and empower themselves to lead a respectful life. The nature of courses offered is such that immediately after completion of course, these individual start to earn some money, initially less, but after a period of time their earnings grow and make them financially independent. Youth are also engaged in various activities for personality development to transform their lives and make them responsible citizens of the society. The trained youths are leading economically independent lives and are able to support themselves and their families financially.

Following Courses are offered at the centre:-

(a) <u>Cutting & Tailoring Course</u>: In the Cutting & Tailoring classes itself around 50 students regularly get training to improve their skills. They are being imparted training on cutting and tailoring of various outfits of ladies and children and also for gents. This course is most popular with ladies and girls as immediately after completion of course and with small investment on one Sewing Machine and some Threads, they earn their livelihood at their home only. If someone is not able to make this small investment, Rakshaks Foundation helps them towards this also. During the year 2018-19, a total of 110 students passed out of this course.

(b) <u>Beauty Culture Course</u>: Around 20 students regularly coming for 6 months duration Beauty Culture Course. Training on Threading, Eyebrows, Hair Styling/ Cutting, Eyes Makeup, Facials and Bridal Makeup etc is imparted to the participants by the trained beauticians. After successful completion of course they could immediately start earnings with small investments at their home only. Rakshaks Foundation also helps them towards this. During the year 2018-19, a total of 40 students passed out of this course.

10. <u>Summary Report</u>:- A Certificate Distribution Program was organized on 5.11.2018 in Foundation's Head Office in Dwarka on the occasion of Annual Day of Rakshaks Foundation. The event at attended by whole Office Staff of Rakshak and students of BSW College apart from beneficiary guests who have successfully completed the various courses. Rakshaks Foundation's Key Person Mr. Rakesh Singh presented the Certificates to 40 beneficiaries who have completed the courses like Computer Application, Cutting & Tailoring, Mahanadi Design, Beauty & Culture etc.

#### ABOUT COMMUNITY

11. Rakshaks Foundation focusing on three nearby Slums of Delhi viz JJ Coloy, Community Sector-3 Dwarka and Machhi Market Colony to undertake our community and social work. In these slums consists of peoples belong to different religion and cast. They earn their livelihood through working as Repacking, Laborer, Rickshaw puller, Raj Mistry and many others. Persons of all ages, children, women, men and old age peoples live in destitute in these slums. Each of the three slums has around 500-600 households and approx 3000 to 4000 population. The Machhi Market Colony is a muslim dominated colony and mostly people work as Rickshaw Puller, Labors etc. Most of the adolescent group drop out from the school and work as maids societies and homes. The population live here is mostly illiterate and do not have a regular source of income. Their source of income is either irregular or seasonal. These people are living in Delhi since last 12 to 15 years and yet they are not able to earn a respectful livelihood. There are so many problem faced by them on daily basis like no access to clean water, no Government ID, Education facilities for their children, drinking water problem, electricity problem, health and hygiene problem livelihood problem, food make problem etc.

12. Rakshaks Foundation has been working with these communities since last five years and have persuaded them to get enroll in Adhar and helped them to get their Voter ID Cards so that they are ignored by the political parties. The foundation also helped them to open their Jan Dhan Accounts in Banks and get them enrolled in Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna @₹12/- per annum. The Foundation has liaised with Govt authorities to address their problems. Some of their problems like Drinking Water and Electricity have been partially addressed

#### WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

13. During the Year 2018 to 2019, the stories of some of our many women achievers:-

(a) <u>Name-Ayushi</u>, a 21 year old girl pursuing B.A from Delhi University's School of Open Learning, is the daughter of Mr. Roop Chandra, a Labourer working in a factory and her mother is a house wife. Ayushi has three younger sisters and one younger brother. The Family originally belongs to District Alwar, Rajasthan and living in Delhi since last 21 years. Ayushi came into contact with us three years ago and at that time, she was 12<sup>th</sup> class pass out from a government school. At that time, she was very quiet, introvert and fearful girl. The



Rakshaks Foundation worked hard with her and provided her day to day Counseling Sessions, Motivation and Life Skill & Moral Education. Afterwards, she was provided with Skill Development Training (Cutting & Tailoring) and Fashion Designing. Initially, she made slow progress but after concerted efforts, she had completed the course in flying colours. With these courses, she has changed the lifestyle of herself and also that of her family. She started earning livelihood by stitching the Ladies Clothes and got initial monthly earning of ₹3000/-. Now, she is also designing the Ladies Apparels and improved her earning to ₹5000/- a month. She actively participates in all activities of the foundation and spares time to impart Cutting, Tailoring and Fashion Designing Training to other young girls and ladies. It is an achievement of foundation and our President also appreciated her and her family for continuous support.

(b) <u>Name-Ranju Devi</u>: A 35 year old illiterate women, wife of Mr Manoj Kumar working as Rajmisrty (Meson) with a monthly income of ₹5000 to ₹6000. She has two daughters and one son and family belong to distract Darbhanga, Bihar. Ranju Devi lives in very small house at Slum Community Railway Colony at Dwarka Delhi since last 22 years. She is a very hard working lady and maintains her home and children very well but always surrounded by economical problems due the meager income of her husband. Rakshaks Foundation contacted



her and enrolled her Cutting and Tailoring course. After successful completion of course she started stitching ladies garments of nearby localities at a very reasonable rate of ₹50/- to ₹80/-. Earlier she used to earn around ₹100/- per day, but now, her per day earning goes up to ₹200/- making a monthly income of ₹6000/-. Now she is able to support to her family. Due to her good initiative for earning, Ranju Devi's family income got doubled and now they are able to provide their children good health and education. Her family is very happy and proud of her achievement.

(c) <u>Name-Sital</u>: A 19 year old girl passed 12th class from the government school. Her father Mr Dharmesh is a Vegetable Seller and mother is house wife. Sital is the eldest of five siblings and her two brothers and two sisters never gone to school. She was good in studies and wanted to go for higher education. However, due to economic problems she could not do so and used to work at home. Rakshaks reached to her and provided her counseling and motivation classes. Subsequently, she was enrolled into Cutting & Tailoring Course and Mehandi Culture

Course in the foundation training course and menantic culture Course in the foundation training center at Dwarka. After successful completion of both courses, she has got a very well hand in stitching of ladies garments and started to earn ₹150/- to ₹200/- per day and making it to ₹5000/to ₹6000/- per month at home. Her achievement is also a motivational factor in the communities at JJ colony Dwarka. Now she is pursuing Fashion Designing Course. Her family is very happy because she is able to support her siblings and got them admitted in a nearby govt school.

(d) <u>Name-Kajal</u>: A 19 year old girl, passed 12<sup>th</sup> class from a Govt school daughter of Mr Raju Singh working as Labourer at a construction site and mother is working as maid. Kajal is third eldest of six siblings with one brother and two sisters studying in VI & V respectively and her two elder sisters are married. Her family lives in very poor conditions as earning of her both parents is not sufficed to meet even basic requirements of such a large family. After that Rakshaks foundation staff reached to Kajal's family, initially they were reluctant. We conducted counseling sessions for Kajal and also for her family. Afterwards, they permitted her and

Kajal joined the Cutting and Tailoring Course and also the Beauty Culture classes. She was regular in class and very active and shown great interest on vocational training. After successful completion of both the courses, Kajal has opened a small Beauty Parlour at home and doing beautician work in nearby localities. She has started to earn around earn ₹200/- to ₹250/- rupees per day and around ₹6000/- to ₹7000/- per month. With her earnings, Kajal is able to support her family and also uses this money for her higher education. It is an achievement for her and also for her family and express their gratitude to Rakshaks Foundation.

(e) <u>Name-Manisha</u>: She is a 22 year old girl, pursuing B.A Program from SOL DU. Her father is working in factory and mother is a house wife. She has one younger brother studying in class 6<sup>th</sup> in the government school. She is very intelligent girl and has great interest in all vocational activities. Her catching power is very strong as she participated in Mahanadi Culture, Cutting & Tailoring and Beauty Culture courses in Rakshaks foundation and successfully completed all. Her family is very proud of her as she started to earn a monthly income of ₹5000/- to ₹6000/- and able to support his family and also paying her higher education also.







(f) Name: -Savita Devi A 20 year old girl from Bihar got married at an early age and came to Delhi in 2016 with her husband. Her husband is a Labourer at a construction site and both were living in very destitute conditions. When Rakshaks Foundation staff reached out to her, initially, she and her husband both were reluctant. However, after several counseling sessions with her and also with her husband, she was permitted to attend regular Skill Development Training classes for Cutting and Tailoring. After successful completion of course, she started stitching and tailoring work at home and now she is able to earn ₹300/- to ₹400/- per day and ₹9000/to ₹10,000/-.per month and supporting her family in great way. Rakshaks Foundation wishes her all the best in her life.

(g) <u>Name: Sita Devi</u> A 27 year old women who and her three children were left alone by her husband. She was living with her children in slum communities and was in search of job for her living. The Rakshaks Foundation staff outreached to Sita Devi and got her enrolled in Tailoring and Cutting classes. She is very hard working lady and learned cutting & tailoring very fast and never absented herself in the class. Her children also get supported by Rakshaks Foundation by providing them education classes. Sita Devi completed six month Cutting & Tailoring course





and got employed at foundation itself. Now she is stitching guard belts and earns ₹300/ per day and able to earn her livelihood.

(h) <u>Name: Priyanka</u> A 24 year old girl got married at an early age of 18 year hailed from Biha and came to Delhi in 2016 with her husband. Her husband is a Labourer at a construction site and both were living in very destitute conditions. When Rakshaks Foundation staff reached out to her, initially, she and her husband both were reluctant. However, after several counseling sessions with her and also with her husband, she was permitted to attend regular Skill Development Training classes for Cutting and Tailoring. After successful completion of course, she started stitching and

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tailoring work at home and now she is able to earn ₹300/- to ₹400/- per day and ₹9000/- to ₹10,000/-.per month and supporting her family in great way. Rakshaks Foundation wishes her all the best in her life.

(i) <u>Name: Madhuri</u> A 26 year old illiterate women, wife of Mr. Shailesh Kumar working as Rajmisrty (Meson) with a monthly income of ₹5000 to ₹6000. She has two daughters and one son and family belong to distract Darbhanga, Bihar. Madhuri Devi lives in very small house at Slum Community Railway Colony at Dwarka Delhi since last 22 years. She is a very hard working lady and maintains her home and children very well but always surrounded by economical problems due the meager income of her husband. Rakshaks Foundation



contacted her and enrolled her Cutting and Tailoring course. After successful completion of course she started stitching ladies garments of nearby localities at a very reasonable rate of ₹50/- to ₹80/-. (j) <u>Name: Meera</u> A 35 year old disabled woman with Left Foot and her husband also handicapped. Her husband sells Gutka, Tobacco and Cigerate etc on her trycycle. They have four children and with her husband's meagre income, the family was living in destitute. Rakshaks Foundation staff reached to her and got her enrolled in Jute Craft work and Cutting & Trailoring classes. six month After successful completion of course, she started stitching and tailoring work at home and now she is able to earn ₹300/- to ₹400/- per day and ₹9000/- to ₹10,000/-.per month and supporting her family



in great way. Rakshaks Foundation wishes her all the best in her life.

#### COMMUNITIES DEVELOPMENT WORK

14. Rakshaks Foundation staff, according to action plan, go door to door to three slum areas viz JJ Colony, Community Sector-3 Dwarka and Machchi Market Colony on regular basis and meet families in the communities. The families have been persuaded to send their children to school for education as education is very important not only to the child and its family but also for the building of a strong Nation with 100% literacy rate. They have been counseled that if in case, they are not able to get their children enrolled in nearby Govt School, they should send their children to Rakshaks Foundation's Children Education Classes. It has been emphasized that education is a trait, a person need everywhere and can make use of it in every field of life. It also makes them aware about their rights and responsibilities towards society. After counseling and understanding the need, some of them send their children in our center where their children gain the knowledge, skill learning, education etc. Rakshaks Foundation is providing good & healthy environment for education and skill development training like Cutting and Tailoring, Mehandi, Beautician etc. Foundation has educated around 320 students in the year 2018-19.



COMMUNITY MOBILIZATION

#### **CHILDREN DEVELOPMENT**

15. <u>Children Education Classes:</u> Rakshaks Foundation runs the Children Education Classes in the Dwarka. Foundation has provided education to underprivileged children of ages between 5 to 14 years who do not go to any school. The curriculum for all children is different so according to age with an aim to get them admitted in a regular school under the Right to Education Act 2009. According to RTE Act 2009, a 5 year child admitted in 1<sup>st</sup> class, 6 year child in 2<sup>nd</sup> class, 8 year child in 3<sup>rd</sup> class and 9year 4<sup>th</sup> class and 10 year child admitted in 5<sup>th</sup> class and so on. The children are prepared according to their age and class intended for admission. During the year 2018-19, 35 students got admitted in the schools like DPS, BJS, MCD Government Schools. Apart from this, a total number of children 36 children got admitted in the MCD Primary government school in NC/KG. It was good achievement of the year. The following points are emphasized during the classes:-

- Moral Education
- Communication with older peoples
- Values
- Fundamental right under child education
- Stories for motivation
- Bal Sabha meeting with children
- Drawing and painting
- Art and crafts
- Health and hygiene issues etc.

#### CHILDREN EDUCATION CLASSES

#### **RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION**

**Recycled & Jute Products:** Rakshaks Foundation is running a Program to 17. impart training on making beautiful products in order to earn livelihood for underprivileged sections of society. People associated with our foundation i.e. youth girls and women are making items like- Decorated Diyas, Wax Candles, Gel Candles, from waste material and used cloths. Apart from this, 10-15 girls/women have been involved in making Jute Products like Shopping Bags, Bookmarks, Water Bottle Covers and Folders etc. These products are very popular with locals, and during the festive season, these products sell like hot cakes. The Selling Price of the products is being decided by the participating girls/women only in order to develop While fixing the Selling Price of a product, these their entrepreneurship trait. girls/women have been suggested to consider the factors like cost of material, cost of their own efforts, packing cost and Transportation cost. After getting cost of a product, add reasonable profit to it. This way they also able to learn how the pricing of a product is done. These products are made available to the local markets through Stalls and otherwise and sold on very reasonable price. All the earnings of these products are distributed among these girls/women involved in production of these beautiful products.

18. <u>Art & Craft and Mehandi Designing</u>: Rakshaks Foundation also conducts courses for Art and Craft and Mehandi Designing. Around 20-25 girls and ladies regularly take classes for these courses. Mostly those girls/ladies join these courses who have already enrolled in either Cutting & Tailoring Course or Beauty Culture Course, as these add one more skill to their prospects with minimum





















19. Rakshaks Foundation regularly organize meetings/seminars/lectures for young girls and cover topics like Fundamental Rights, Gender Equality, Hormonal and Physical Changes in Girls' Body on Puberty, HIV/AIDS, Health & Hygiene, Small Savings etc.

Fundamental Rights: Foundation has invited Mr. Varun Pathak (a) (Advocate), the Legal Advisor to make the children aware about Fundamental Rights provided to every citizen of India by Indian Constitution. He gave a detailed description about all the Fundamental Rights viz The Right to Equality, Right to Freedom, Right against Exploitation, Right to Freedom of Religion, Right to Culture and Education, Right to Constitutional Remedies and Right to Privacy. Specifically, they have also been used to abolish untouchability and thus prohibit discrimination on the grounds of religion, race, caste, sex, or place of birth. They also forbid trafficking of human beings and forced labour (a crime). They also protect cultural and educational rights of religious and linguistic minorities by allowing them to preserve their languages and also establish and administer their own education institutions. Rakshaks Foundation's Project Coordinator Ms. Pooja Sharma also made them aware about the Child Education. They were informed that every child in Indian has right to education and all children are entitled to free education up to Class 8th in government schools and even books, stationary, uniform etc also provided free of cost. It is also provisioned that 25% seats in each Public School are reserved for students from BPL category. Admission process for these schools starts in Dec/Jan and completed by Mar each year.

(b) **<u>T.B. Cancer, HIV AIDS Disease</u>**: Foundation has invited Dr. Pushpanjali Gupta, Specialist for Tuberculosis Diseases from Delhi Government Dispensary Shahadara, Delhi. She explained about Causes, Symptoms and treatment for tuberculosis. She also discuss the preventive measures for the disease. She also emphasized to stay away from eating tobacco, smoking, Hookah etc as Tobacco is a very dangerous for human beings and main cause of cancer & other diseases.

(c) <u>Social Problems</u>: Ms. Bhawani Yadav, Senior Manager from TATA Insituite of Social Services (TISS) was invited in Rakshaks Foundation to spread awareness about effects of generalised problem of society like Drug Addication, Provarty, Alchoal Abouse, Sexual Abouse, Unemoplyment, Female Genital Mutilation etc. she told with them how to deal with this types of cases. Young girls were told if they were going through any type of humilation, they should always raise a voice and inform their parents. Parents should immediately take action on their problems and report to Govt agencies, if required.

(d) <u>Good Touch & Bad Touch</u>: Children especially young girls have been regularly counselled about good touch and bad touch. Adolescent girls are also counselled about the harmonal and physical changes happening in their bodies.
